





- Population percentage change during this period was 5.0




**2021 Total Population In The Region Of Peel** 




# Population Growth in the Region of Peel

 There are important variations in the population growth among municipalities.








 Urbanization is transforming the face and size of dwellings.
















# Region of Peel Population

- While the population of the Region of Peel is aging, an influx of new immigrants in the labour age strengthens the regional economic activity.
- South Asian, Black, Chinese and Filipino people are the more prevalent ethnic groups in the Region of Peel, but their percentage has decreased because of the inclusion of new ethnic groups as visible minorities.
- Canadian Indigenous People in the Region of Peel represent 0.5 percent of the population, being predominantly from First Nation and Metis origins.




