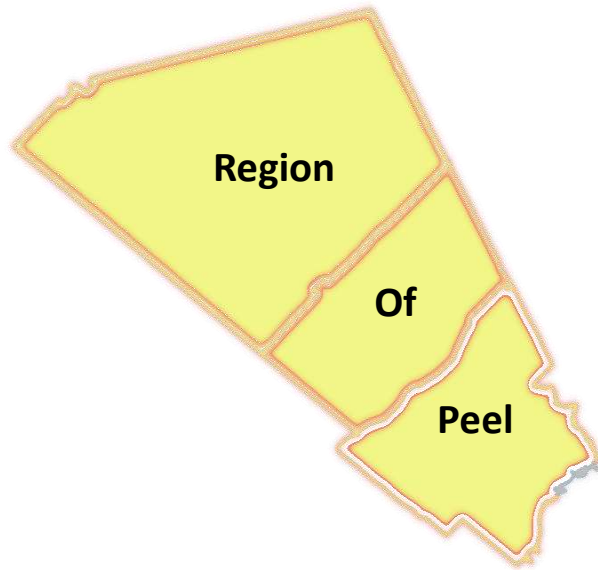

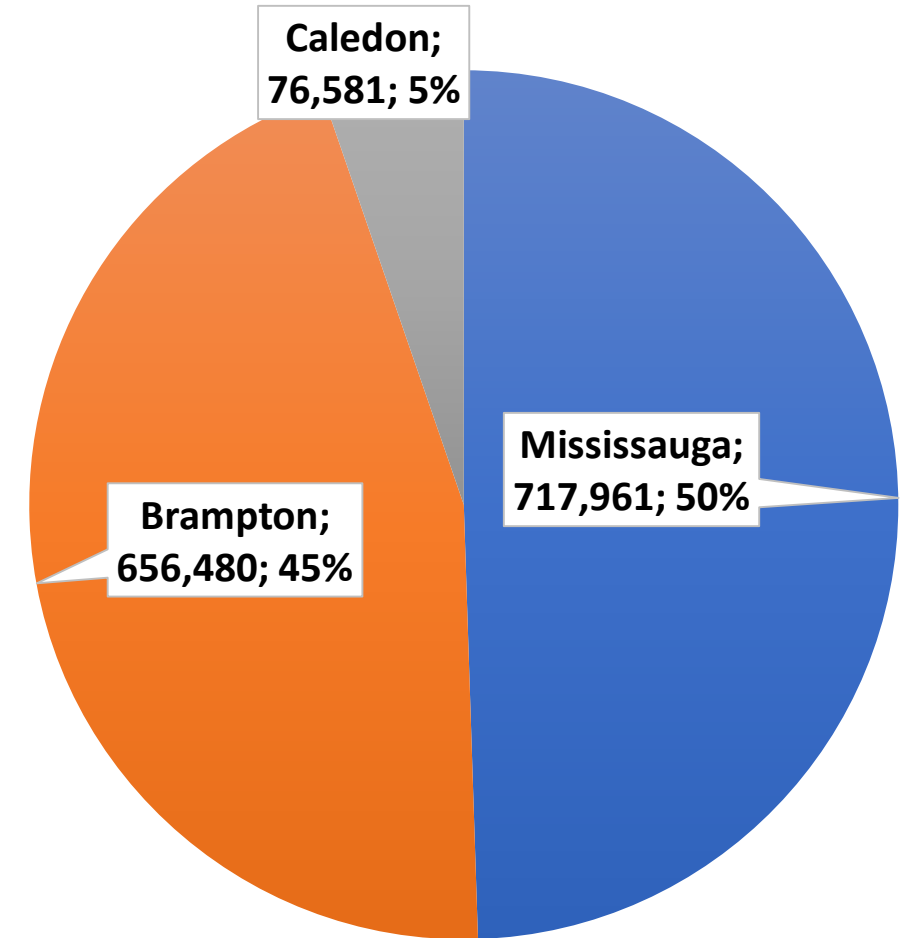
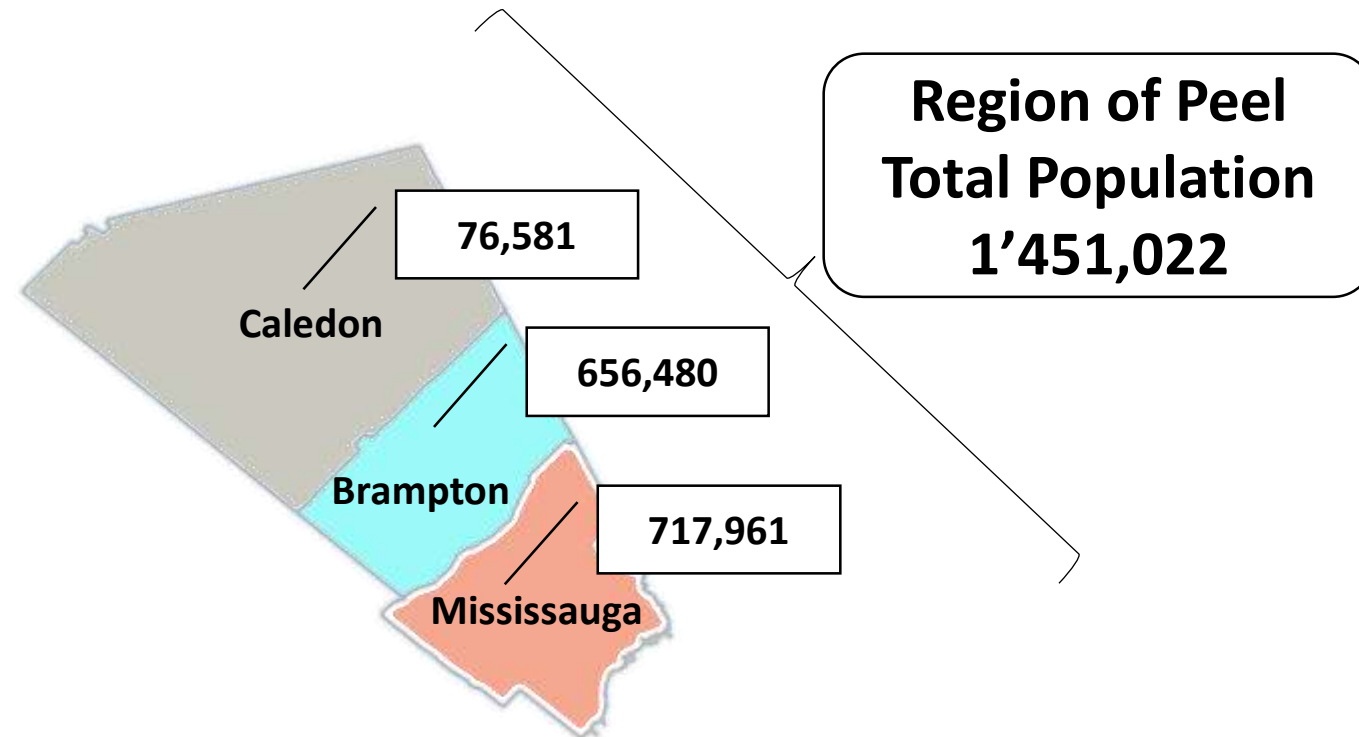

Population in the Region of Peel – Census 2021

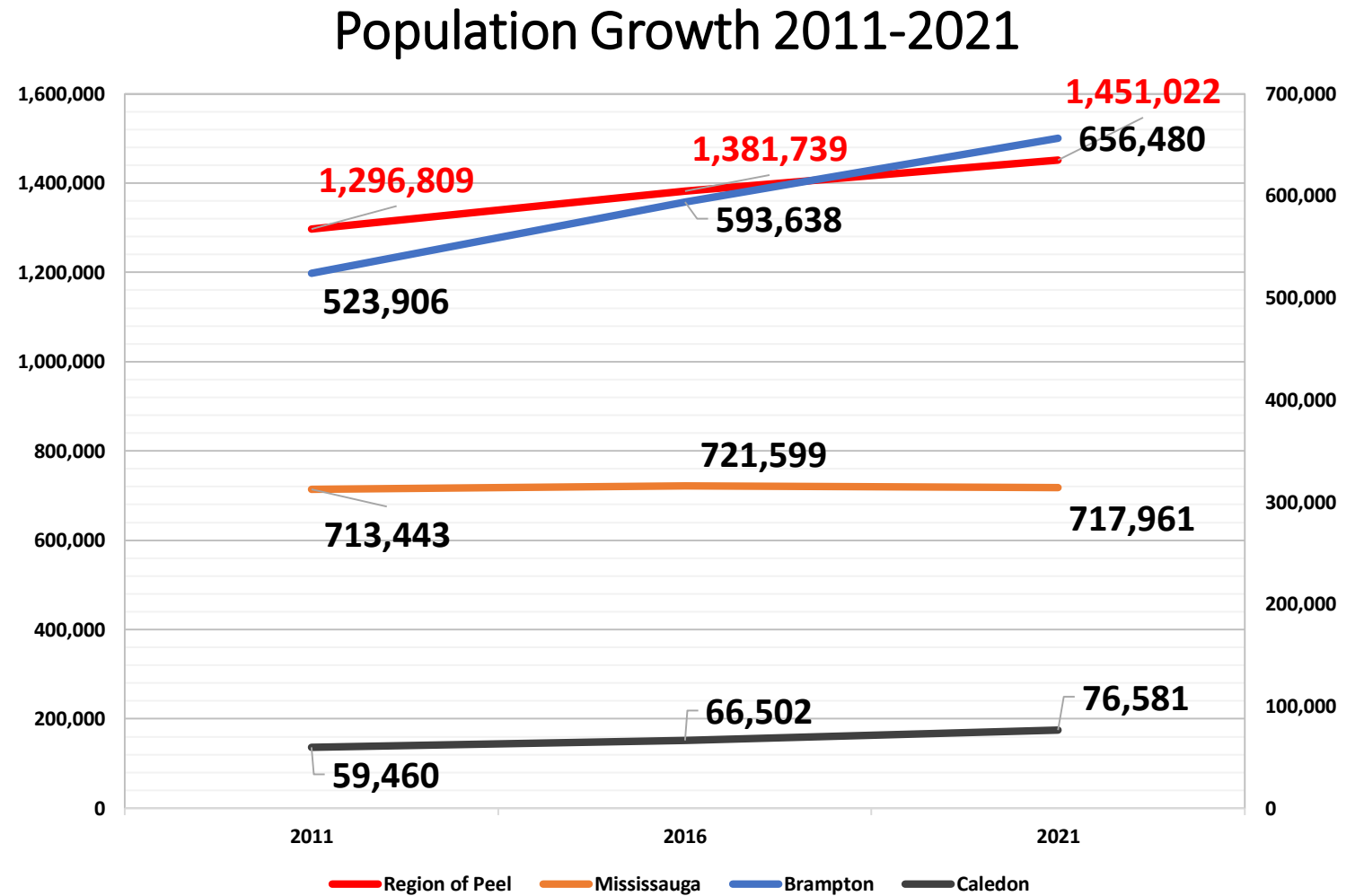
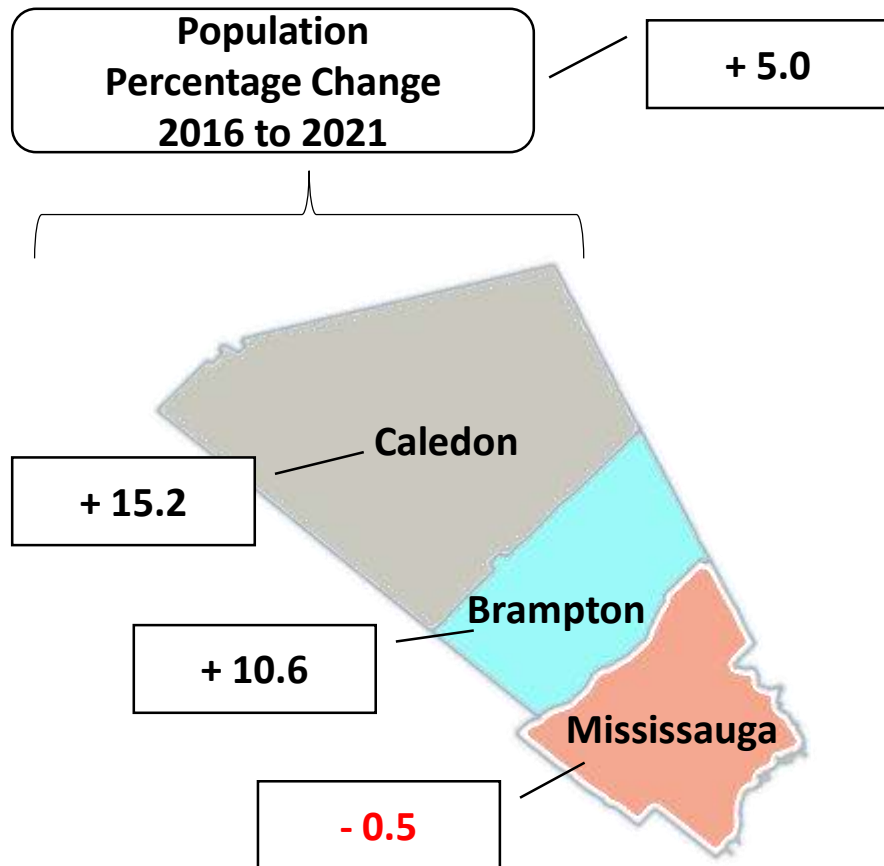
- The population of the Region of Peel continues to grow from 1'381,739 in 2016 to 1'451,022 in 2021.

- There are important variations in the population growth among municipalities.

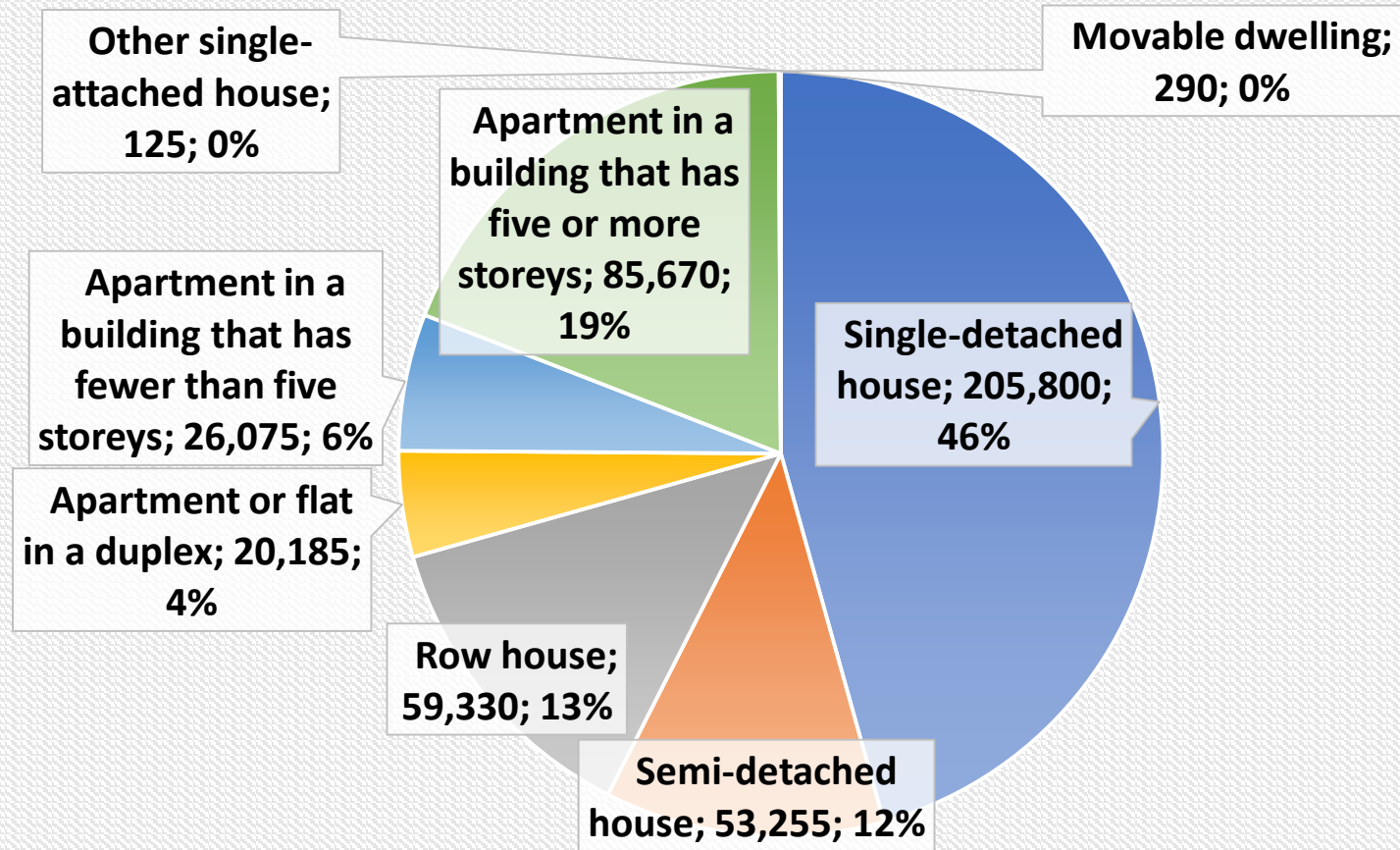

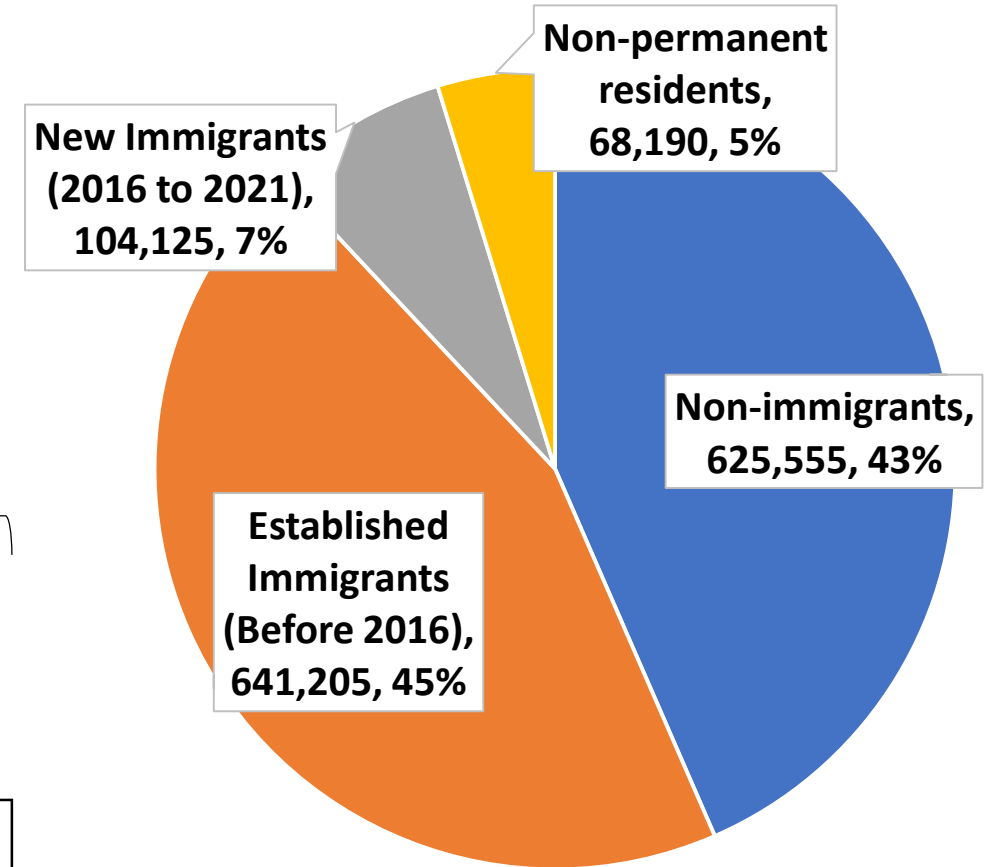
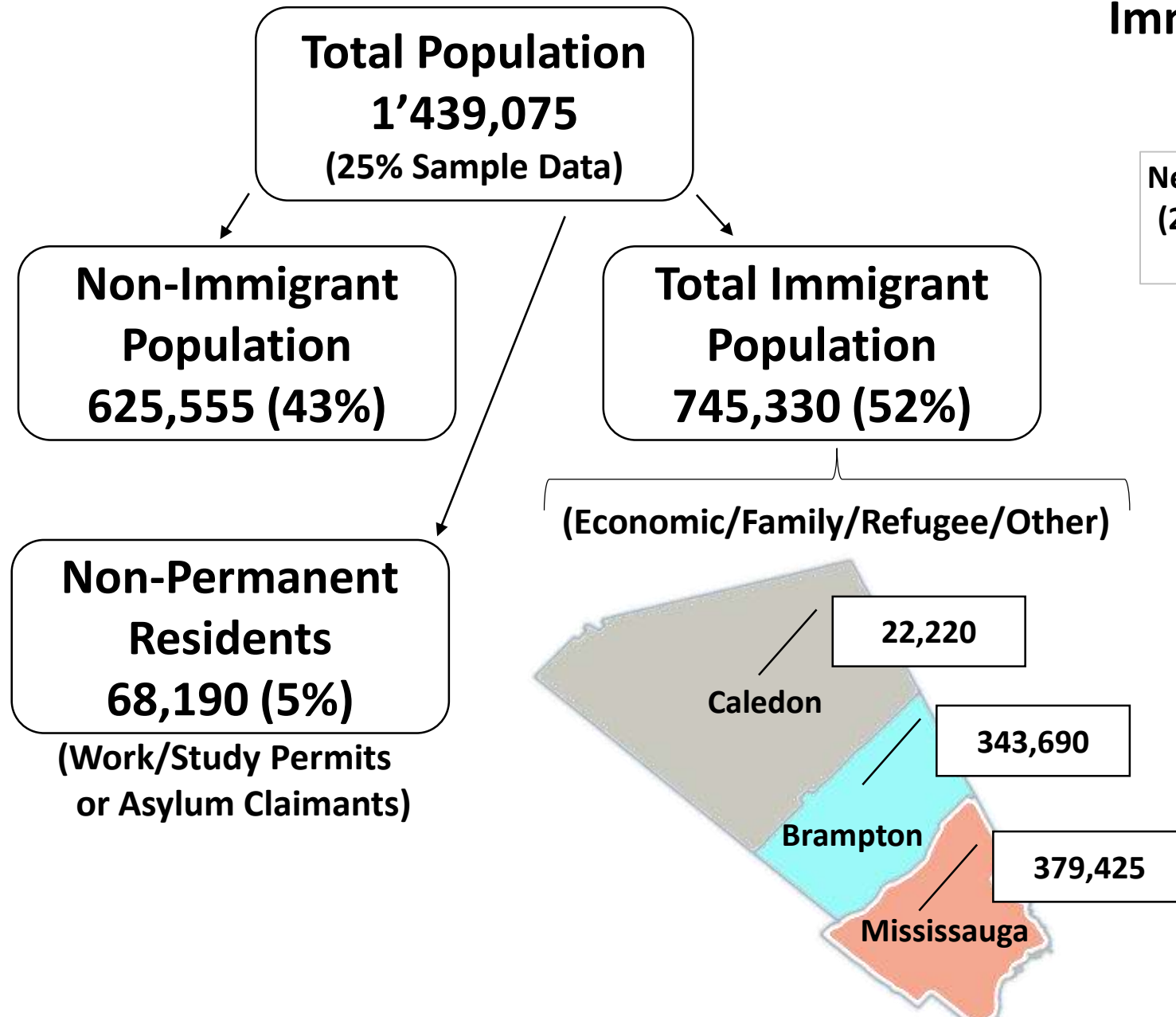
Occupied Private Dwellings In The Region Of Peel

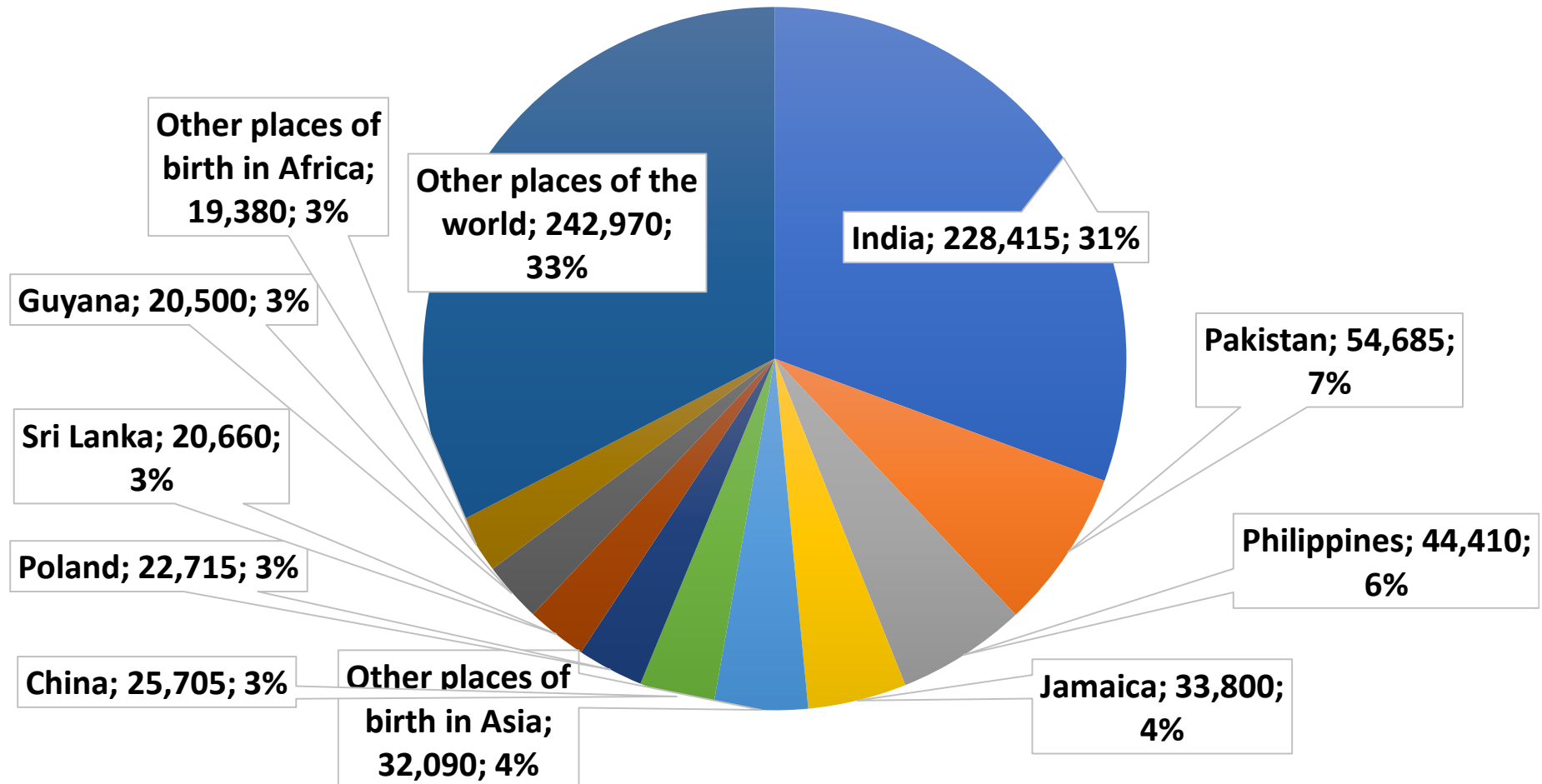
Immigrant Population in the Region of Peel

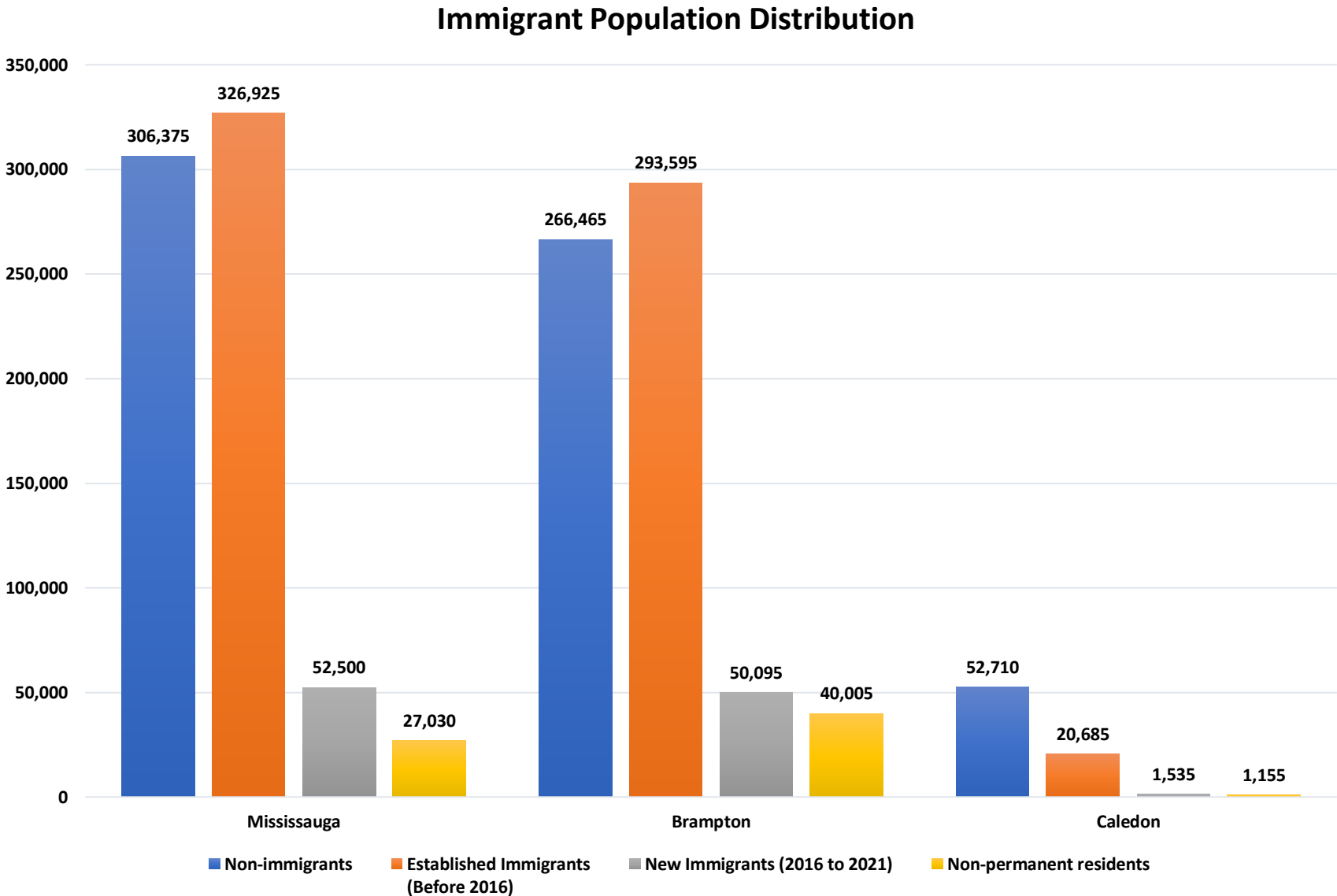

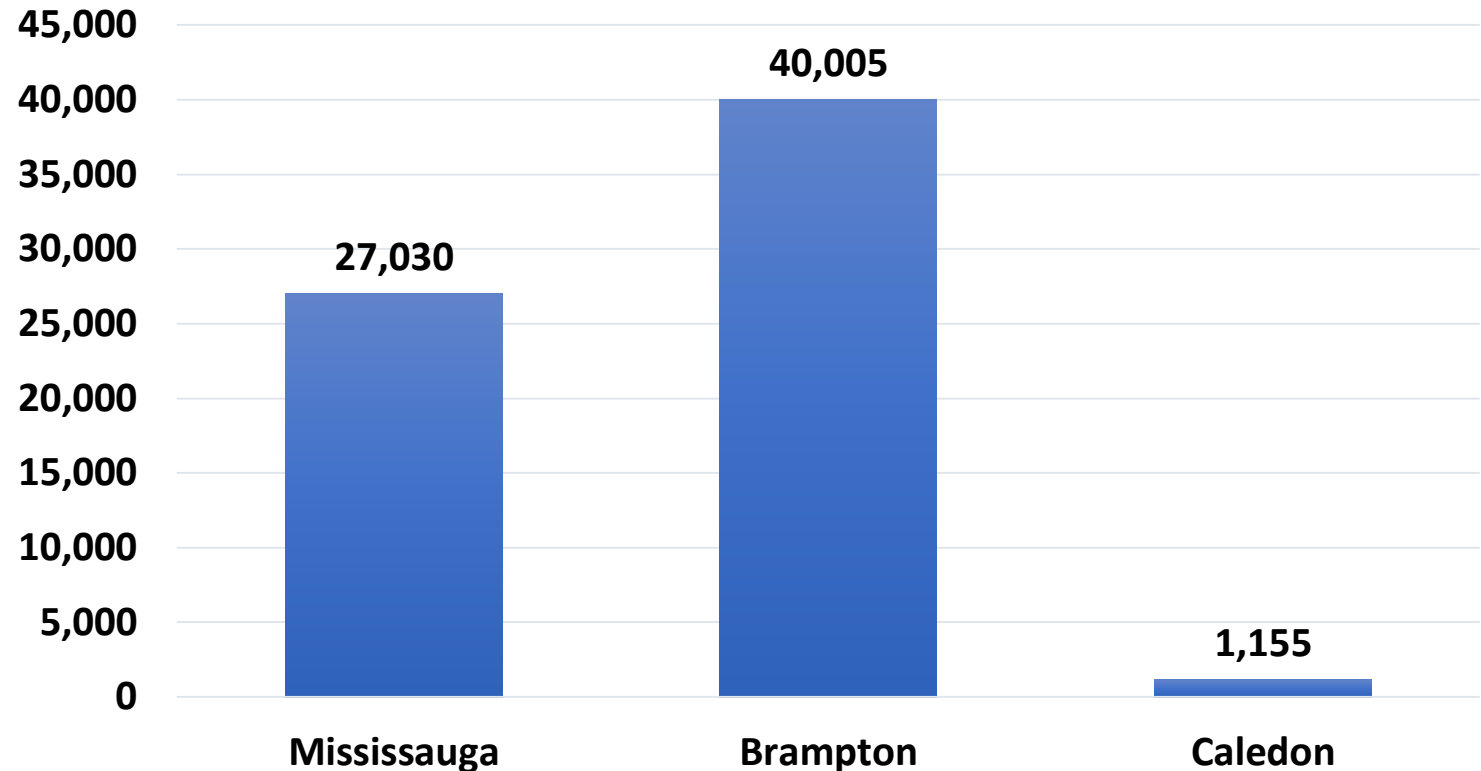

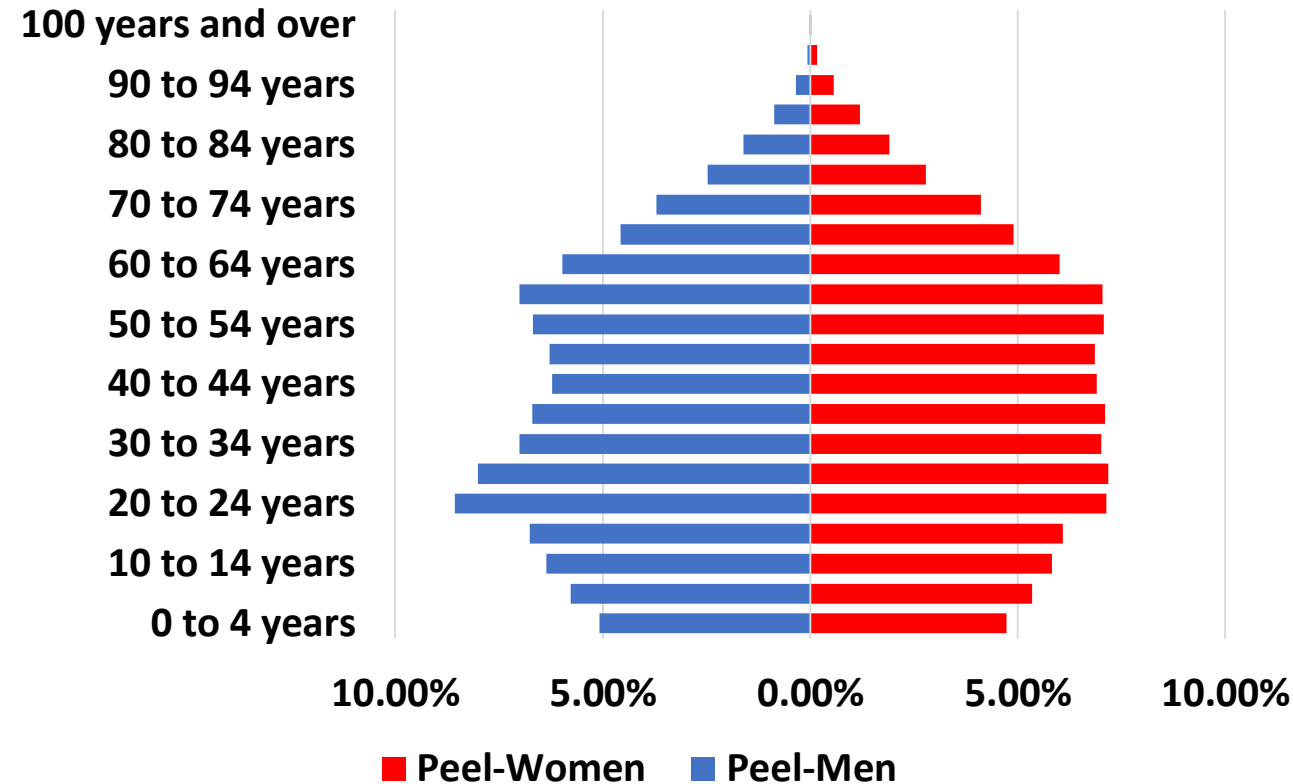

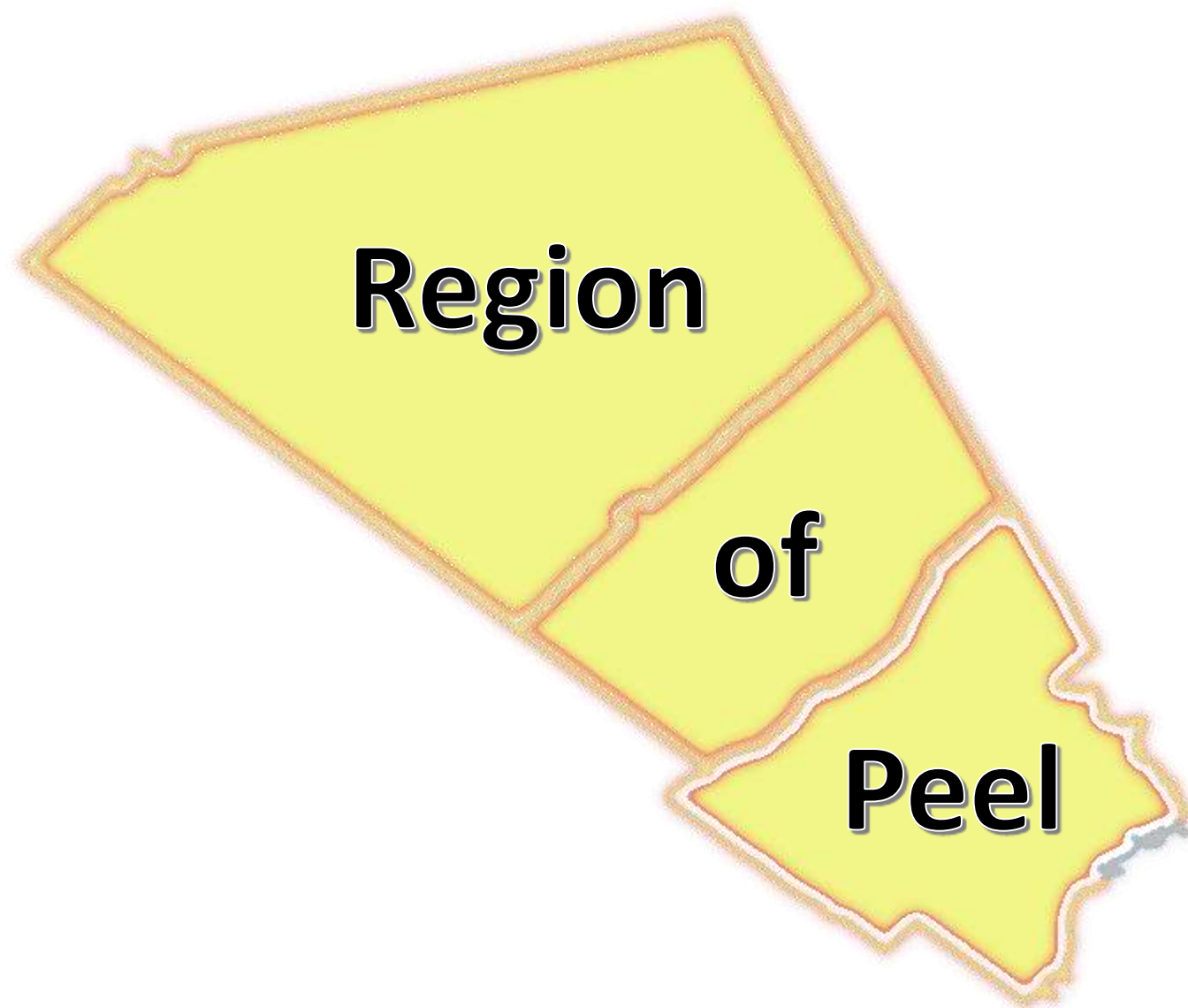


Region of Peel Population

- While the population of the Region of Peel is aging, an influx of new immigrants in the labour age strengthens the regional economic activity.
- South Asian, Black, Chinese and Filipino people are the more prevalent ethnic groups in the Region of Peel, but their percentage has decreased because of the inclusion of new ethnic groups as visible minorities.
- Canadian Indigenous People in the Region of Peel represent 0.5 percent of the population, being predominantly from First Nation and Metis origins.

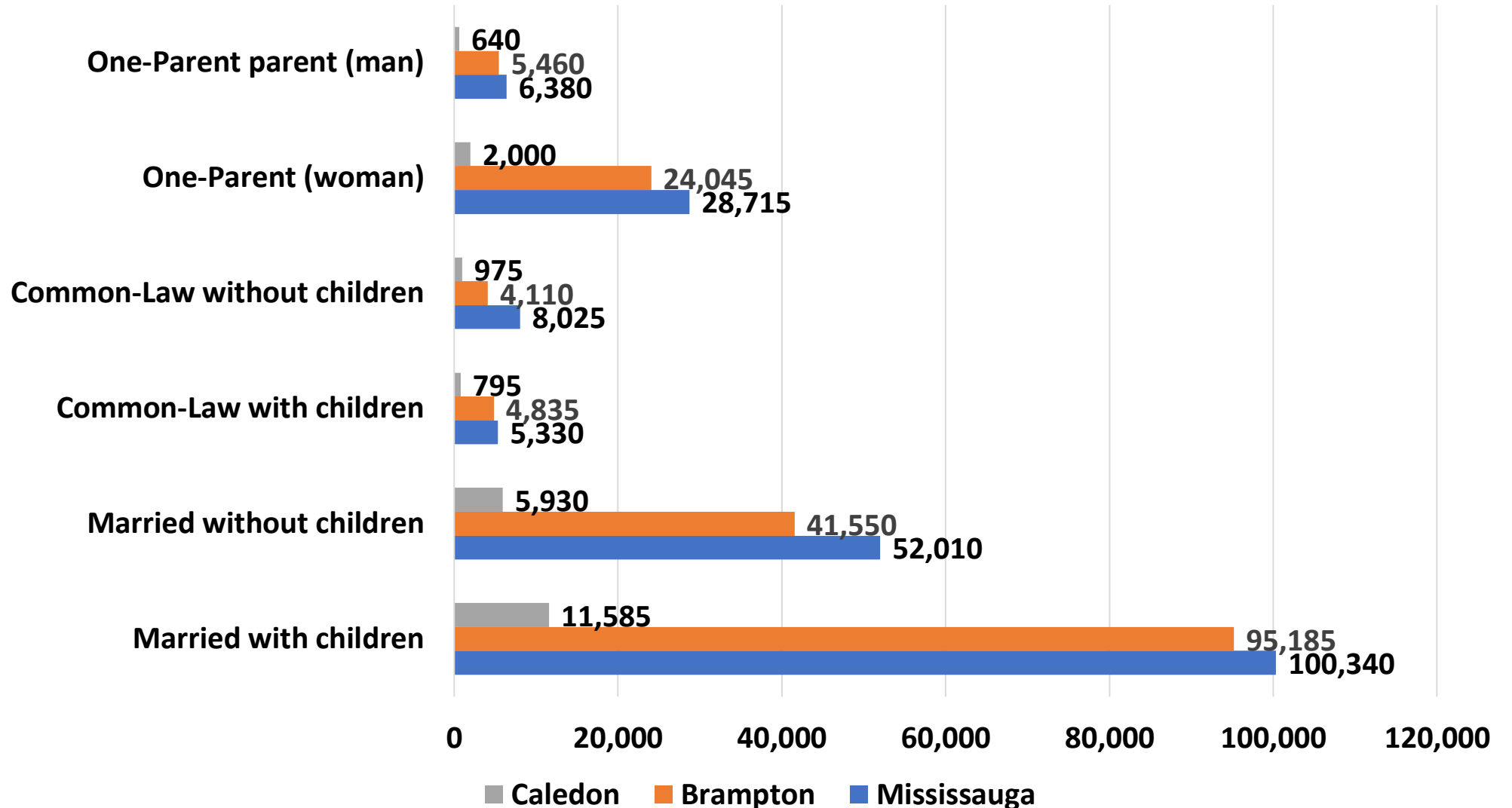

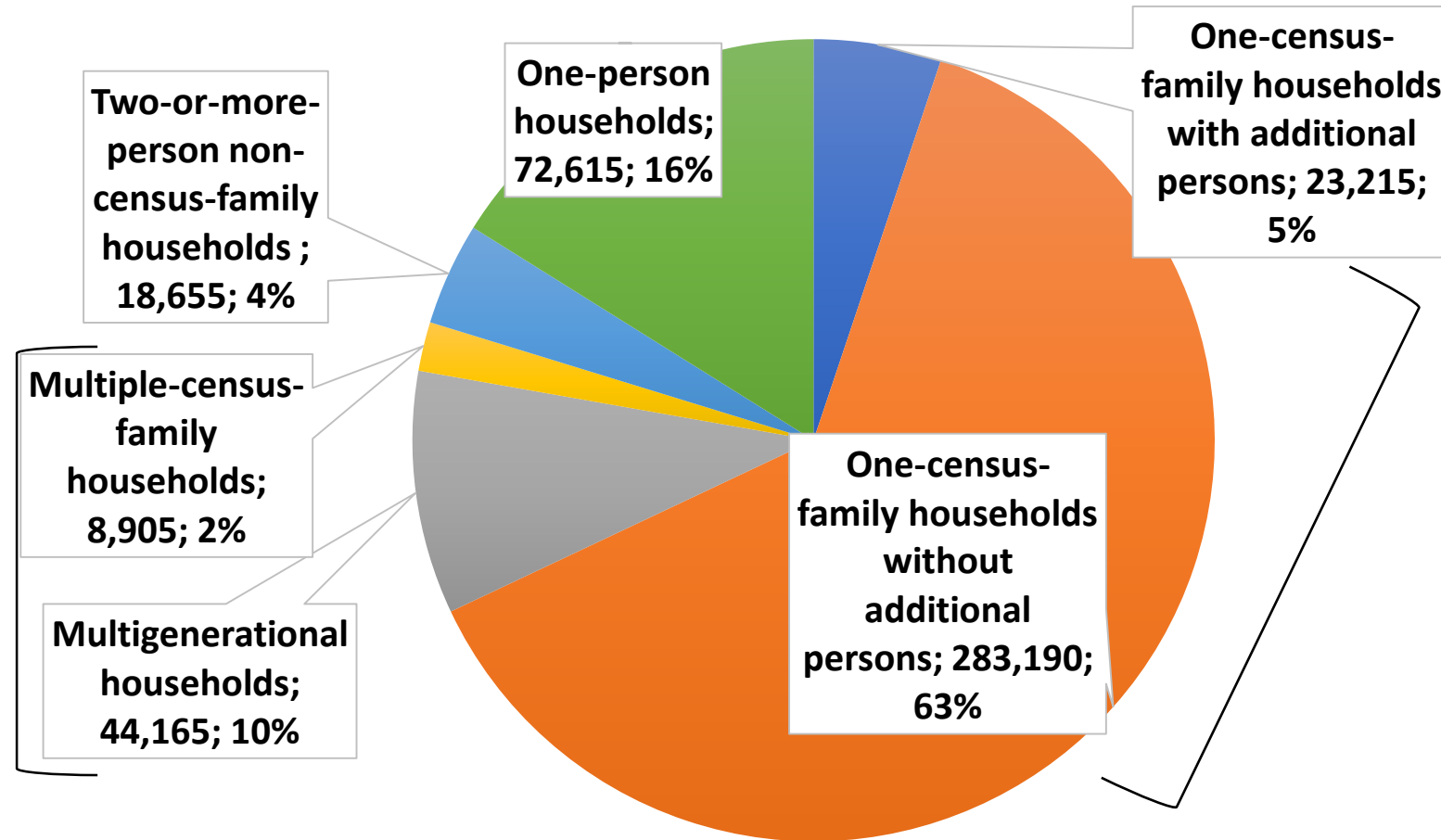

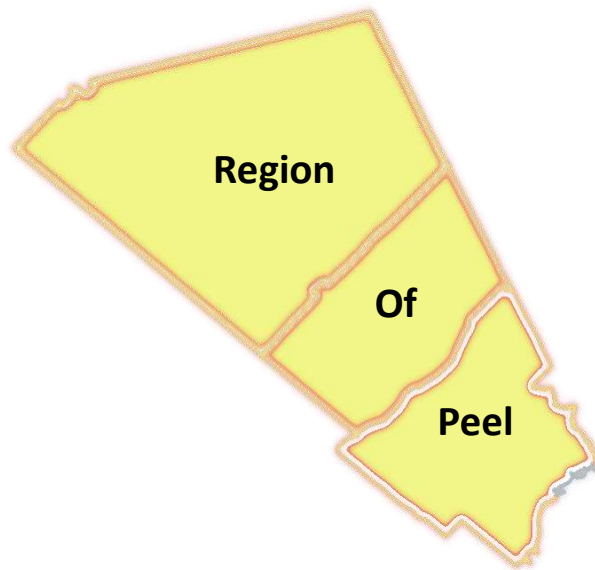
Families by Household Type
